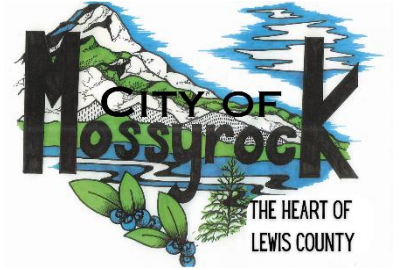


MOSSYROCK CITY COUNCIL
MEETING MINUTES
July 15, 2026



Call to order (6:00 pm)

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Roll Call:

Present: Mark Thompson, Juliana Simon, Teresa Quinlan, Ron Lindgren, Samuel Schellenger
A quorum was established.

Approval of Agenda

June vouchers were approved by Juliana Simon and Mark Thompson. A **motion** was made to approve and consent the agenda by Samuel Schellenger and Julianna Simon **seconded** the motion. No further discussion. **Motion passed** unanimously.

Staff and Committee Reports

Public Works Report (Randall Sasser)

Mayor Sasser shared the water loss report, stating that the city should be around 30% for water loss within the city. Currently we are at 41.7%. We have experienced some major water leaks that contribute to this number. June was very high. We are aware of a large leak on Del Ray and are waiting for permitting from Lewis County before repairs can be completed. Other leaks reported and repaired mainly by the group doing the boring. Goal is to bring percentage closer to 30%. New lift station in the park was completed a few weeks ago. This system pumps sewage from the park to the treatment center. Positive report from the mayor on the PW team, and their efforts. One goal in the future is to clean and widen the trail to the "mossy rock."

Law Enforcement (Chief Cournyer) – June 2026

Chief Cournyer reported the department is in a busy season in both towns. They have been focused on traffic and speeding. Chief reported with the new officer on patrol they can make more of a presence to address the City's concerns of speeding in town.

Treasurer Report – June 2026

Prepared by Jessica Bragg, City Treasurer / Read by Amy Edgington – Detailed financial overview for June 2026 was presented to City Council members. No questions were raised. The report was accepted.

Park Department (Marcia Manley)

Board met May 18, 2026 – No new developments. Park Board will not be meeting until September 21.

Planning Commission (Marcia Manley)

Planning Commission met on June 13th and made recommendations on the expansion of the bunkhouse at the Tree Farm. Marcia reported they intended to add landscaping to help the property look more like a residence. Planning Commission was excited to accept a letter of interest from Roger Sewright to hold a position. Roger gave a short introduction and

shared his desire to be a part of the process of helping Mossyrock. Mayor Sasser appointed Roger Sewright as the newest member of the Planning Commission.

Public Comments

(In regard to Bunk House Extension) Colleen Sewright showed concern about a van backing out on Mossyrock Rd W in the fog if a circular driveway was not approved and the safety issue this created.

New Business

Old Business:

Ordinance 524, authority to waive the community center fees for the VFW to hold meetings. Mayor Sasser shared the history of how this ordinance was created. Ron Lindgren **motioned** to accept Ordinance 524. Mark Thompson **seconded** the motion. Short discussion occurred. **Motion passed** unanimously.

Other Items:

- Samuel Schellenger brought notice to the Primary election being next month, the importance of reading the ballot and voting. He expressed to read the document well to understand exactly what you are voting on.
- Speeding discussion. Sasser reported that we are unable to use speed bumps / speed humps because of the trucks. He suggested we paint a yellow strip on the road with the speed limit. "We need to get people to slow down" stated Sasser. Randall Sasser reminded everyone that the speed limit is always 20mph on Williams even when school is out of session.
- Saturday, September 26 the City is hosting a paper Shred Day for sensitive documents. Households can bring up to 3 boxes for proper disposal.
- Lewis County Fire District 3 shared the effects of the continuation of the EMS Levy vs not. LCFD shared that the district is funded by two levy's and does not receive funds from the city, county or state. August 4th will be the vote. For further questions please reach out to Chief Edgington.
- Ebike concerns were brought up by Mayor Sasser. Electric scooters were brought up in the discussion. They have been seen in town and the potential for problems is there. Chief Cole supplied that Morton has a city ordinance for the use of bikes within the business area that might be worth looking at.
- Mayor Sasser and Buddy Rose have been working on verbiage about Mossyrock to be added on a sign near the time capsule. They will share when they feel like it is ready. Mayor Sasser shared his desire to create a place where we can slow down as a community. He stated that two six-foot benches were placed near the time capsule with the hope to have residents / visitors sit, stay and chat awhile. He would like to add more benches around town to add to that feel and to help keep the small town feeling alive in Mossyrock.
- Citizen mentioned Godfrey has become a bit of a racetrack. He requested that law take notice of that area.

Ron Lindgren **motioned** to adjourn the meeting at 7:11 pm. Julianna Simon **seconded** the motion. No further discussion needed. **Motion passed** unanimously. Next City Council meeting August 19, 2026.
